
PANDEMIC PORTRAITS

STEPS

Use cardboard to draw on. With a pencil, draw a dashed line down the middle to help with symmetry. Lightly sketch the shape of the face.

Sketch what you want un-derneath your mask! Rule: no nose or mouth.
Be creative!




Add details: hair, eyebrows, eyes, ears.



Outline your sketch with a black marker.



Lightly erase pencil marks.
Add color with markers. Take a step back, then add any final touches and you're done!

the slits.

SHARE & DISCUSS

Each student shares their portrait and describes how they came up with what's underneath their mask.
